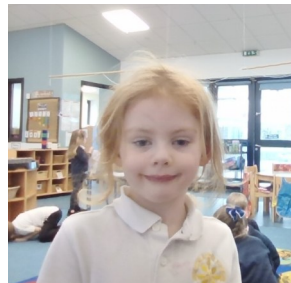

Wembury Class



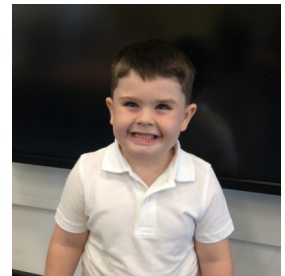
C is our star learner this week. She has settled well into Nursery and has shown great listening skills. We are proud of you. Keep up the hard work!
