Stapleton discovery

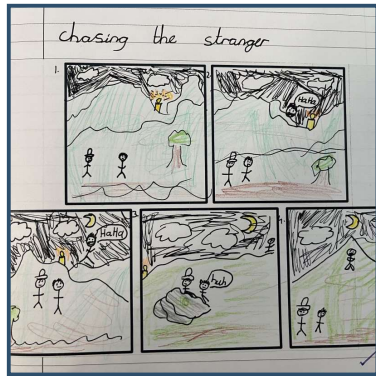
