IS YOUR CHILD DUE TO START SECONDARY SCHOOL IN SEPTEMBER 2025?

It may seem a long way ahead but now is the time to start thinking about your child moving from primary school onto secondary school. If your child was born between 1 September 2013 and 31 August 2014, you will be eligible to apply for a secondary school place.

Information about applying for a place and the individual secondary schools will be on our website from Tuesday 3 September 2024 at <a href="https://www.plymouth.gov.uk/schooladmissions">www.plymouth.gov.uk/schooladmissions</a>. From here, you can apply online for school places and read the guide for parents which contains the links to the individual school's admission policies and forms.

Applying online is quick and easy - all you need is an email address. Once you have applied, we will let you know which school your child has been allocated on Monday 3 March 2025.

You can apply for a school place via the Citizen's Portal by visiting our website at: www.plymouth.gov.uk/schooladmissions. The deadline to apply is the 31 October 2024.

- All Plymouth's 18 secondary schools hold 'open events' for families to visit the school and speak to staff. Please refer to the individual school's websites for dates and further information.
- Some schools give priority to with exceptional medical or social need and will ask for submission of a Supplementary Information Form (SIF) as proof.
- If you are applying for a place at a faith school on faith grounds, you must also fill out a Supplementary Information Form (SIF), which you can obtain from the school. Some schools give priority to children of members of staff and will ask for submission of a Supplementary Information Form (SIF) as proof.
- Supplementary intormation form (a) right as proof.

  Please read the admission policy for each school carefully.

  If you are applying for a place at a girl's grammar school, you must register to take the 11plus examination through the school's website. The closing date for registering is 31

  August 2024 at 12 noon. Please refer to the individual school's website.

## **Free School Meals**



You may be entitled to apply for Free School Meals for your child/ren if you receive Universal Credit, Income Support, Income Based JobSeekers Allowance, Income Related Element of Employment and Support Allowance, Guaranteed Credit element of Pension Credit or Child Tax Credit (without Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of £16,190 or less.

We would urge parents who may be eligible for Free School Meals for the children to contact the school office for a form as soon as possible. This is very important, even if your child does not wish to take up the free meal. The register of FSM entitlement affects our overall school budget and we may be missing out on funding as a result.

Please so not confuse this with Universal Free School Meal entitlement for children in Years Reception to Year Two.

### Re: Important Changes to the law regarding attendance

Many of you may already be aware that certain changes will come into place in August of this year regarding attendance, which means that the way attendance is managed by the Local Authority is changing.

Attached to this letter is a letter from Plymouth City Council which clearly shows the new processes and how this affects you as a parent/carer

As a Trust we are committed to working with you, and your families, to support attendance in school in the best way that we can and this relies on good communication and openness. It will be even more important moving forward that this is the case, in order to ensure that as few of our families as possible are affected by these changes.

The Trust's new Attendance Policy will be available on our school websites by the end of term. This includes the new '52 Absence Request Form', which is also attached. This should be used for all absence requests from the I" September 2024.

## IMPORTANT CHANGES TO THE LAW REGARDING PENALTY NOTICES FOR UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

A new National Framework for Penalty Notices for school absence, including unauthorised holiday absence, is being introduced following changes to the law. These new Government regulations will come into effect from 19 August 2024 and we wanted to bring this to your attention now, as it will affect when penalty notices are issued in Plymouth.

### What are the changes?

- There will be a new national threshold of 10 unauthorised sessions for any reason (equivalent to 5 school days) within a rolling 10 school week period for when a penalty notice must be considered.
- 2. The new rules mean you will no longer be able to take your child out of school for one week's holiday without a penalty notice being issued.
- There will be an increase in the penalty fine from £60 to £80 if paid in 21 days. If the fine is not paid by the first 21 days, it will rise to £160 if paid within 28 days of being issued.
- If a second penalty fine is issued to the same parent for the same child within a 3-year rolling period, the fine will automatically rise to £160 with no option to pay the lower rate of £80.
- 5. If a parent then commits a third offence in a 3-year rolling period, the local authority will need to consider other enforcement options available to them.

Please see FAOs below with more information about how the new rules may affect you.

We would like to thank parents and carers for their support in making sure that children do not miss any valuable learning time.

FAQs

If I have been issued with a penalty notice before 19th August 2024, will this be counted if I am issued with another penalty notice from September onwards?

No, the new limits come into effect from 19 August 2024.

If I have already booked a holiday for next year, could I receive a penalty fine at the new higher

Taxes:
Yes, if the absence has not been authorised by the Head Teacher of your child's school. Remember, only a
Head Teacher can agree whether an absence can be authorised in exceptional circumstances.

- Who can be issued with a penalty notice?

   Each parent can receive a fine for each child who has had unauthorised absence from school.

   In education law, anyone who lives with a child and who has day-to-day care of the child is also considered to be a parent whether they are the biological parent or not. For example, this will include step-parents and partners.

Do the new rules only apply to holidays during term time?

No, it applies to all unauthorised absence from school including holidays. Unauthorised absence includes other absence that has not been agreed such as truancy, arriving late after the register has closed and failing to provide reasons for absence.

How do I request for my child to have leave granted during term time?
You must submit an Absence Request form at least 20 days before the proposed absence. It will be for your child's Head Teacher to make a decision as to whether there are exceptional circumstances that will allow them to grant the time off. Do not assume that the absence will be granted until you have received confirmation from the school.

Do the 10 sessions of unauthorised absence have to be taken all at the same time before a penalty fine is issued?

No, a penalty fine can be issued for any combination of absences over a 10-week rolling period. They can be consecutive or non-consecutive and can span over two terms.

What happens if I am issued with a penalty fine and I don't pay it?
Unauthorised absence from school is an offence under s444 of the Education Act 1996. A penalty fine is an opportunity for you to settle out of court. If you don't take this opportunity, you can be prosecuted for the offence of failing to ensure your child's regular attendance.

What should I do If I am worried about my child's attendance? In the first instance you should contact your child's school and ask for advice on how they can support you to improve the situation. You can also contact the Inclusion, Attendance and Welfare Team
