HOUSE DAY

We investigated 'Tumbling Toast' which explored the probability of buttered toast landing butter-side down when dropped from a height. We enjoyed dropping the buttered toast 20 times from a height of 1 metre in order to carry out this test fairly. Using a tally chart helped us to clearly see how many times the toast landed either butter-side down or butter-side up. It was good to investigate whether adding jam to the toast altered our results and some of us even went on to drop the toast from a height of 2 metres. We found it interesting comparing our predictions with our results. All of us had a great time working together in teams to complete this 'Tumbling Toast' investigation.













HOUSE DAY AND SCIENCE WEEK AT BEECHWOOD

As part of science week, Year 5 have enjoyed completing an experiment to test whether substances are soluble or insoluble.

We has to carefully measure the water and add the substances in order to ensure our test was fair.




J is our star learner this week for trying really hard in her experiments during science week and making cross curriculum links — especially in maths.
