






Year 6 Spring Term 2

Our topic this term has been Biomes of the World, we have been learning about animals including humans and looking at the circulatory system including the functions of the heart and blood vessels within the blood. In Geography, we have been studying the maps of the world and comparing different biomes—linking to the climates of the world- focusing on human and physical features. We were lucky enough to visit the Eden Project to see, feel and compare the Mediterranean and Rainforest biome. In English, we have written

a documentary narrative based on the book the Ways of the Wolf, followed by a balanced argument debating whether wolves should or should not be reintroduced to the UK, using scientific data and evidence to back up their arguments.







We watched documentaries and studied scientific research from the reintroduction of the wolves in Yellow Stone National Park in 1995, particularly analysing the effects of the habitats and vegetation afterwards to support our balanced argument.
